

Quorum and Class Presidencies

Called of God	<p>You were called by revelation. When you are set apart, you receive priesthood power to love and lead your class or quorum to follow the Savior Jesus Christ.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ponder what it means to receive this sacred trust and power to love and serve your class and quorum members.
Minister to Those You Serve	<p>Start by getting to know each of your members hobbies, family circumstances, interests, talents, and challenges. This will help you receive revelation in how you can be their friend.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Get a list of your class or quorum members from your leaders.• Write down any impressions on how you can minister and serve your quorum or class members as you look at their names.• Begin to pray for your quorum and class members by name.• Act upon the spiritual promptings you receive for your class or quorum members.
Quorum or Class Presidency Meetings	<p>Talk with your adult leaders and find a time each week you can meet as a class or quorum presidency. Here are some quick tips on what to do during your presidency meetings;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Call on someone to pray.• Review the name of every member of your quorum or class to see how they are doing and discuss any immediate needs they may have. Counsel together and make plans to minister as needed.• Review any assignments the Bishopric have asked you to perform. Counsel together and make plans to accomplish them.• Review the service and activities calendar for the next month and those assigned to be responsible to organize them. Counsel together and follow-up with assigned members to help them be successful.• Review any Sunday assignments – who is conducting in class or quorum meetings, sacrament assignments, visit the sick, etc.• Ask the adult leaders if there is anything they want to train or share with your presidency.• Call on someone to pray to dismiss the class or quorum presidency meeting. <p>See sample class or quorum presidency agenda</p>

Quorum or Class Meetings	<p>Don't be afraid to lead. Always strive to make everyone feel loved, welcomed, and needed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Begin each meeting (Sunday or weekday) with prayer. • Ask about those not able to attend and how to invite them in the future. • Announce any assignments or service/activities that are coming up. • Turn the time over to the instructor on Sunday or the quorum or class members assigned to lead the activity. • At the end of your meeting or activity, share or invite others to share lessons learned and ways to live and act upon what you learned. • Call on someone to pray and dismiss the meeting.
Service and Activity Planning	<p>Let every member of your class or quorum lead, learn, and grow. In your quorum or class presidency meetings and class and quorum meetings discuss service and activity ideas that help meet the interests and needs of each member. Plan activities that they will enjoy participating in.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Invite each member to share what activities and service they would like to participate in. • Create a 6-month calendar of ideas. • Assign (2) members of your class or quorum to be responsible for each activity. • Each quorum or class presidency meeting discuss how to help those assigned be successful. • In quorum or class meetings, share upcoming activities, remind those assigned, and get everyone excited to participate. • Adjust and learn from each activity.
